PREREGISTRATION REQUIRED! Entry form must be received by 5 pm September 21, 2009. Any entry not preregistered will not be accepted. There will no longer be any walk-ins accepted on the designated receiving day.

ELIGIBILITY

1. Students in the 7th through 12th grades (NO EXCEPTIONS) in public or private schools in Georgia are eligible to enter this division. (Please see Hobbies Department "Budding Artists" for opportunities for younger children.)

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

2. All entries must be PRE-REGISTERED on official entry forms of the Georgia National Fair by 5 p.m. September 21. USE A SEPARATE ENTRY FORM FOR EACH STUDENT. Entry forms may be duplicated. DO NOT GLUE ENTRY FORM TO THE BACK OF ARTWORK (Entry forms are used by computer operator). **Teachers: Please do not submit more than two works from the same class project if the project produces "look-alike" pieces.**

3. Student's name, address, telephone number, school, age, grade level, Division number, Class number and title of work must be attached securely

or written on BACK of artwork in upper right hand corner.

4. Exhibitors may enter up to four classes in their age division, with a maximum of two entries per class. **Students with multiple entries should submit only one entry/registration form.** The maximum number of entries per student is 8 pieces.

5. Schools with multiple art/photography teachers should coordinate their efforts and submit entries simultaneously. The maximum number of entries per school is 50 pieces.

6. All works must be original and done solely by the entrant. (No copy work, hobby kits, models, paint by numbers or reproductions of any sort will be accepted.)

7. All drawings and paintings on paper must be matted and backed with posterboard, cardboard, or fomecore (total thickness not to exceed 1/4"). Outside mats must be black, white, or off-white only; no color. Canvases are

not to exceed 1/2" in thickness. 2-D work should not exceed 48" in width and 52" in length. **Framed pieces will not be accepted.** DO NOT TAPE STRING OR WIRE TO MATTED WORKS (WILL NOT HOLD UP FOR A TEN DAY EXHIBITION).

8. Jewelry or other small works must be submitted in clear plastic resealable bags with the identification label name, address, telephone number, school, age, grade level, Division number, Class number and title of work) attached INSIDE and other three-dimensional work must have identification label firmly tied to work.

9. Photographs must be mounted on standard mount board (black, white, or off-white; no color) or similar board not to exceed 16x20 inches. The photograph itself must not be smaller than 5x7 inches or greater than 16x20 inches. Fomecore mounts or overlay mats (black, white, or off-white; no color) are acceptable, provided total thickness does not exceed 1/4 inch. Plastic shrink-fit covering is permitted, but glass or frames are prohibited. No masonite, corrugated, or thin poster board is acceptable. Processing, enlarging, mounting, and matting may be done by someone other than the exhibitor.

DELIVERY OF ARTWORK

10. Teachers are asked to bring art entries to the Fairgrounds Saturday, September 26, between 10:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. **Entries not received by 4:00 p.m. will not be accepted. Enter the West gate and follow signs.**

11. All artwork submitted by mail or express (DO NOT SHIP BY BUS) must be of such construction and materials that the work can be easily and safely shipped. Students should insure work sent by mail or express. Entry forms for shipped exhibits should be mailed separately to arrive by Sept. 17.

12. **EXHIBITS SHOULD BE SHIPPED TO ARRIVE BY SEPTEMBER 21.**

Send exhibits to: **Youth Art Entry Department, Georgia National Fair, 401 Larry Walker Parkway, P.O. Box 1367, Perry, GA 31069.** All exhibits sent by mail or express must be prepaid. The box or container used for shipment must be sufficiently strong so that it may be used to return the exhibit to the sender. Sender's name and address must be plainly written on outside of package. If return is to be by mail or express, a **self-addressed label and sufficient postage or shipping fees** must accompany the exhibit. **Responsibility will not be assumed for the return of exhibits for which sufficient shipping charges have not been paid or provided.**

13. Winning entries will remain on exhibit throughout the Fair. **Scheduled release dates are Tuesday & Wednesday, October 20 & 21, 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. and Saturday, October 24 from 10:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. The Georgia National Fair will dispose of any exhibits not claimed by October 30, 2009.**

JUDGING

14. Judges will be chosen from college and university art departments and other Georgia art professionals.

15. Judges are instructed not to award a premium or premiums unless the article or articles are deemed worthy of merit.

16. Judges may subclass where necessary.

17. Judging results will be posted at the Fair.

PREMIUMS

18. All premium money will be paid from the judges' record sheets and not from ribbons that may be attached to exhibits. Premium checks will be mailed after the Fair is over.

19. Superior School Art Awards are presented to the Middle School and High School that win the most blue ribbons.
