Hand-painted porcelain should be brought to the Miller-Murphy-Howard Building Friday, October 1, or Saturday, October 2, between 10:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m.

All other rules governing the Fine Arts Department apply, except:

- Hand-painted porcelain is not juried for acceptance; therefore, no images are required. No entry fee is required.
- Open to all Georgia residents that use the medium of paint on porcelain.
- Artists may enter up to three works per category, except where stated otherwise.
- No seminar pieces may be submitted.
- All entries must be of porcelain. All others will be disqualified. Decal work will not be accepted.
- Entries must be personal work of the exhibitor and must have FIRED SIGNATURE and DATE of completion. Please make certain that the frame does not conceal fired signature. Works must have been completed within the past three years.
- Exhibitor's signature must be neatly concealed for judging. Tape will be removed after judging.
- Judges may reclassify if an item is placed in the wrong category.
- Each entry must be securely fastened together. Display stands will be furnished by the Georgia National Fair, except for pieces of unusual size.
- First through third place and honorable mention ribbons, along with cash prizes may be awarded in each class of each Division as noted. An Award of Excellence Rosette with an additional cash prize may be given in each Division.

FIRING:**20 pts.**

Translucent in the colors, glossy and cleanness of the piece.

Rookwood, Enamel. Grounding, Acid Etching, Gold and other metals applications, Raised Paste, Pen work, Lusters, Modern combinations.
