## ELIGIBILITY

1. Mail entry forms by August 25 for early registration.

2. Please read general rules for exhibitors at the beginning of this book. **IMPORTANT ENTRY INFORMATION GOVERNING ALL DEPARTMENTS WILL BE FOUND THERE AND MUST BE FOLLOWED CLOSELY.**

3. There are many different Divisions in the Textiles Department. Divisions are based on skill level, allowing a broad spectrum of participation while providing a fair system for judging purposes. The **Novice Division** is for the beginner. The **Intermediate Division** is for the more experienced exhibitor whose projects demonstrate more complexity of design. The **Master Division** is offered for the professional exhibitor and for the amateur exhibitor whose work is competitive at the highest level of his/her art. The honor system is used with regard to the proper Division placement for exhibitors. In other words, it will be left to the exhibitor to determine under which Division he/she should exhibit. **All items in a Department must be entered in the same Division.**

4. Entries in this Department are limited to bona fide residents of Georgia.

## ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

5. Entries must be submitted on an official entry form of the Georgia National Fair. Entry forms may be duplicated.

6. Exhibitors should check each section for the number of entries allowed per class. Where multiple entries are allowed, each

entry must exhibit a different style, design, or purpose.

7. All articles that require hanging for display should be brought with wire, etc., attached and ready to hang.

8. All articles must be clean or they will not be displayed.

9. All articles in Textiles must have been handmade and completed by the exhibitor within the last five years.

## PREMIUMS

10. First through third place and Honorable Mention ribbons may be awarded in each Class and an "Award of Excellence" Rosette may be given in each Division.

11. Sweepstakes Plaque and \$25 will be awarded to the Adult and Youth Division winners of the most blue ribbons in Textiles.

12. Premiums will be paid from judges' record sheets and not from ribbons attached to the exhibits. Premium checks will be mailed after the Fair is over.

## JUDGING

13. Any article not up to standard in the Class in which it is exhibited can be ruled out by a judge.

14. Judges are instructed not to award premiums unless articles are deemed worthy of merit. Articles without competition will be judged on their own merit and will receive awards only if deemed worthy by the judges. The decision of the judges will be final.

## ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Exhibitors may enter as many classes as they wish, but not more than one entry per class (unless otherwise listed), and each entry must exhibit a different style, design, or purpose. Up to 5 items allowed in "other not listed" classes, as long as each entry is different by style, design, or purpose, and items do not fit in another category. The "Other Not Listed" category may not be used as a means to exceed the limitation of two items per class.

## PREMIUMS

First through third place and Honorable Mention ribbons may be awarded in each Class. Award Of Excellence Rosette may be awarded in each class.
