1. Please mail entry forms by September 20 for early registration.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

3. Exhibitors may enter a maximum of two items per class. If items have a class and category for entry assigned in this book, they may not be entered in "Other Not Listed" as a means to exceed the limitation of a maximum of two items per class.
4. The Fair will not act as a selling agency. No articles may be shown in this department with a "For Sale" tag attached. Any sales made of articles exhibited in this department will be between the owner and the

prospective purchaser. The Georgia National Fair will place a sign in the display area listing antiques shops who participate in the competitions.

5. True antiques are defined as being at least 100 years old. But in general, items that are at least 50 years old are considered "antique" for this competition. Articles must be owned by the exhibitor. Photocopies of documents will not be accepted for competition.

6. Every effort will be taken to protect exhibits entered. Locked glass cases will be used to display small exhibits; larger items will be displayed in a protected area. Security will be in the building to give reasonable protection during the Fair, but in no event will the management be responsible for any injury or loss which may occur while in transit or while at the Fair.

7. A brief history of articles, if available, would be helpful.

8. Items must be clean.
9. Items to be hung must have sturdy wire and hangers properly attached.
