### ELIGIBILITY

1. **Mail entry forms by September 1 for early registration.**

2. Read General Rules for exhibitors located at the beginning of this book for ENTRY AND DELIVERY INSTRUCTIONS.

3. There are many different divisions in the Hobbies Department. Divisions are based on *skill* level or *age* level, allowing a broad spectrum of participation while providing a fair system for judging purposes. The *Open Division* is offered for the professional exhibitor and for the amateur exhibitor whose work is competitive at the highest level of his/her art. The honor system is used with regard to the proper division placement for exhibitors. In other words, it will be left to the exhibitor to determine under which division he/she should exhibit.

### ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

4. Only one entry per class except where stated otherwise. Multiple entries are permitted in "other not listed" classes as long as each entry is different by design, purpose or materials used.

5. All exhibits that require hanging for display should be brought with hanger and/or wire, attached and ready to hang. **Pictures without a hanger will not be judged or displayed. (No sawtooth hangers accepted.)**

6. All entries in this department will be displayed at the discretion of the management.

7. **Attention teachers and group leaders: Please do not submit more than two works from the same class project if the project produces "look-alike" pieces.**

### JUDGING

8. Judges are instructed not to award premiums unless articles are deemed worthy of merit. Articles without competition will be judged on their own merit and will receive awards only if deemed meritorious by the judges. The decisions of the judges will be final.

9. Judges may subclass where necessary.

### PREMIUMS

10. First through third place and Honorable Mention ribbons and cash prizes may be awarded in each class and an Award of Excellence Rosette may be given in each Section.

11. Premiums will be paid from the judges' record sheets after the Fair is over.

Sweepstakes Plaques and \$25 will be presented to the Georgia Hobbyists with the most blue ribbons, Adult/Open and Youth Divisions.
