ELIGIBILITY

1. Mail entry forms by September 20 for early registration.
2. Any student in the 7th through 12th grades (NO EXCEPTIONS!) in public or private schools in Georgia is eligible to enter this division. (Please see Hobbies Department "Budding Artists" for opportunities for younger children.)

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

3. All entries must be submitted on official entry forms of the Georgia National Fair. Entry forms may be duplicated. DO NOT GLUE ENTRY FORM TO BACK OF ART WORK. (Entry forms are used by computer operator.) **Attention Teachers: Please do not submit more than two works from the same class project if the project produces "look-alike" pieces.**
4. Exhibitors may enter up to four classes in their age division, with maximum of two entries per class. ATTENTION ART TEACHERS: The maximum number of entries per student is 8 pieces. The maximum number of entries per school is 50 pieces.
5. All works must be original and done solely by the entrant. (No copy work, hobby kits, models, paint by numbers or reproductions of any sort will be accepted.)
6. All drawings must be matted and backed with posterboard, cardboard

or fomecore (total thickness not to exceed 1/4"). Outside mats must be black, white or off-white only; no color. Paintings on paper must be matted. Canvases are not to exceed 1/2" in thickness. 2-D work should not exceed 48" in width and 52" in length. **Framed pieces will NOT be accepted.** DO NOT TAPE STRING OR WIRE TO MATTED WORKS...WILL NOT HOLD UP FOR A TEN-DAY EXHIBITION. Exhibitor's name, age, address, school, Division No. and Class No. must be written on BACK of painting/drawing in upper right-hand corner.

7. Jewelry or other small works must be submitted in clear plastic resealable bags with the identification label (name, address, school) attached INSIDE and other three-dimensional work must have identification label firmly tied to work.
8. Photographs must be mounted on standard mount board (black, white or off-white; no color) or similar board not to exceed 16x20 inches. The photograph itself must not be smaller than 5x7 inches or greater than 16x20 inches. Fomecore mounts or overlay mats (black, white or off-white; no color) are acceptable, provided total thickness does not exceed 1/4 inch.

Plastic shrink-fit covering is permitted, but glass or frames are prohibited. No masonite, corrugated or thin poster board is acceptable. Processing, enlarging, mounting and matting may be done by someone other than the exhibitor. Exhibitor's name, address, age, Division No. and Class No. must be written on the BACK upper right-hand corner of the exhibit.

DELIVERY OF ART WORK

9. Teachers are asked to bring art entries to the Fairgrounds Saturday, September 23, between 10:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. **Entries not received by 4:00 p.m. will not be accepted. Enter the west gate and follow signs.**

10. All artwork submitted by mail or express (DO NOT SHIP BY BUS) must be of such construction and materials that the work can be easily and safely shipped. Students should insure work sent by mail or express. **EXHIBITS SHOULD BE SHIPPED TO ARRIVE BY SEPTEMBER 20.** Send exhibits with entry forms properly filled out to: **Youth Art Entry Department, Georgia National Fair, 401 Larry Walker Parkway, P.O. Box 1367, Perry, GA 31069.** All exhibits sent by mail or express must be prepaid. The box or container used for shipment must be sufficiently strong so that it may be used to return the exhibit to the sender. Sender's name and address must be plainly written on outside of package. If return is to be by mail or express, **a self-addressed label and sufficient postage or shipping fees** must accompany the exhibit. **Responsibility will not be assumed for the return of exhibits for which sufficient shipping charges have not been paid or provided.**

11. Winning entries will remain on exhibit throughout the Fair. Scheduled release dates are October 16 and 17, 10:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. The Georgia National Fair will dispose of any exhibits not claimed by October 31, 2006.

JUDGING

12. Judges will be chosen from college and university art departments and other Georgia art professionals.

13. Judges are instructed not to award a premium or premiums unless article or articles are deemed worthy of merit.

14. Judges may subclass where necessary.

15. Judging results will be posted at the Fair.

PREMIUMS

16. All premium money will be paid from the judges' record sheets and not from ribbons that may be attached to the exhibits. Premiums will be paid after the Fair is over.
