- Be sure your invention is safe.
- 4-Hers may receive help in the construction of the model. **Neither science fair exhibit boards nor the use of building blocks, LEGOS, K'Nex, etc. will be accepted.**
- Inventions will be judged on originality (10 pts), usefulness and safety (5 pts), and written explanation (5 pts).

5. Exhibits will be judged on originality (10 pts), and overall appearance (10 pts).

2. **Each county is limited to ten terrariums and ten dish gardens.**
3. Terrariums must be completely covered and contain plants appropriate for terrarium environment, **and must have been growing for a minimum of three weeks.** No live animals. Contact your 4-H agent for more details.
4. Dish Gardens should contain plants having similar light, moisture, and temperature requirements and fit in a shallow container. Dish Gardens should not be covered or enclosed. Contact your 4-H agent for more details.
5. No electrical or battery operated accessories will be allowed.
6. Terrariums and dish gardens will be judged on construction (5 pts), plant selection (5 pts), condition of plants (5 pts), and general appearance (5 pts).

The Completed Design:

- Can be in color or black and white.

- Must be copy friendly.

- Must have been generated by a computer.

- Must use the official 4-H clover available at:

http://www.national4-hheadquarters.gov/emblem/4h_name.htm.

- Must be printed on 8 1/2" x 11" white card stock. An electronic version of the graphic on disc or CD must accompany the printed graphic.

- Must be saved on CD in .jpeg or .gif format.

- Should be an original design - not a copy or rework of another design. Copyrighted characters (such as Snoopy and Charlie Brown from the "Peanuts" comic strip) may not be used. Use of graphics from the World Wide Web is allowed.

- The following information must be printed legibly on the back of the entry: name, address, county, phone number, (with area code), and section (147, 148, or 149).

1. Entries must be printed on 8 1/2" x 11" white card stock and an electronic version of the graphic on disc or CD must accompany the printed graphic.
2. No more than one entry per person.
3. Graphics become the property of Georgia 4-H upon completion of display at the Fair and may be used for promotional purposes by Georgia 4-H.
4. All winning entries will be displayed. Other entries may be displayed as space permits.
